INTRODUCTION

Dear Reader,

When I after twelve years as Primate of The Apostolic Episcopal Church (The Holy Eastern Catholic and Apostolic Orthodox Church) have learnt that Br. Francis C Spataro was willing to accept succeeding me, I was extremely pleased. 1. We have for many years worked closely together both in the Church and in academic connections, why we have so much in common. 2. Thanks to the fact that I since the beginning of 1970's have served the scattered remnants of The Catholic Apostolic Church ("The Irvingites"), Br. Francis is the only one in the history, not belonging to this communion, who has been consecrated in her international procathedral in London. I am very glad of having been able to offer him this favor as an entry to his Episcopal career. 3. As Br. Francis has accepted being the Primate of The Apostolic Episcopal Church Communion Worldwide from 1 March 1998, the international headquarters have rejoined to the area where the first headquarters were situated: Long Island, NY, USA.

It is owing to unstable health I have resigned. Under these circumstances I have reduced most of my activities to my profession as professor in church history, even retired.

The present material consists of two sections. The first one *The Apostolic Episcopal Church*. *Past and Present* is a revised review I originally composed as an accompanying letter to my retirement. The second one *The apostolic successions of The Apostolic Episcopal Church* - the main purpose of this document - is an outline I a long time ago have promised Br. Francis. For an exhaustive account on the history of The Apostolic Episcopal Church I refer to my studies *An Apostolic Episcopal Ministry*. *Archbishop Arthur W Brooks and Christ's Church By-the-Sea. In Memory and Inspiration* and *The Order of Corporate Reunion*.

Recently I have made six important discoveries. 1. The French Lazarists have played an intermediary role for the clandestine consecrations performed by Maran Mar Yosif Emmanuel II Thoma, which serve as background to the growth of The Apostolic Episcopal Church. In this connection I have also found that Maran Mar Yosif Emmanuel II Thoma was acting with his Patriarchal Vicar. 2. Bishop Anthony Joseph Aneed is some time between January and September 1934 also consecrated by Archbishop Sophronios Bishara in New York. 3. Archbishop Leon Checkemian has not, as has been stated, been consecrated a Bishop in The Armenian Catholic Church. 4. Joannes Paulus PP II is consecrated in the succession from Mgr Scipio Cardinal Rebiba (1504-1577). At a personal visit at Biblioteca Apostolica Vaticana in October 2003, thanks to helpful officials, I got answer on the long-lived question about the consecration of Pater Rebiba. He was consecrated as Auxiliary Bishop of Chieti and Titular Bishop of Amyclae in 1541, March 16, by Mgr Gian Piero [Giovanni Pietro/Joannes Petrus] Cardinal Carafa [Caraffa] (1476-1559), Archbishop of Chieti, well-known as Paulus PP IV (Vicarius Christi 1555-1559) and as the creator of ghettos for Jews and of Index Librorum Prohibitorum in 1557. 5. The reason why Bishop John More-Moreno during his later years used Mar Chrysostomos in stead of Chrysostomos as his ecclesiastical name is that he in 1943 was consecrated sub conditione in the Chaldean Catholic Church succession in order to expand his mission. 6. Mar Antoïne Lefebüre was honored Titular Bishop of Arzon.

Finally, accept my most cordial greetings from heart to heart with one of my favorite psalms, Psalm 1.

Section I

THE APOSTOLIC EPISCOPAL CHURCH Past and Present

THE APOSTOLIC EPISCOPAL CHURCH (HOLY EASTERN CATHOLIC AND APOSTOLIC ORTHODOX CHURCH)

The Apostolic Episcopal Church grew out of a missionary movement by some churchmen in The State of New York to provide spiritual ministrations for the scattered adherents of the Near East churches. The movement began in 1922, but it was not until 1924 that a group succeeded in forming The Anglican Universal Church of Christ in the United States of America (Chaldean). Canonical authority for the body came through Mar Antoine (Lefebüre) (1862-1953) in his capacity of special commissary in USA, appointed by Maran Mar Yosif Emmanuel II Thoma (1852-1947), 1900-1947 patriarch of The Chaldean Catholic Church, a uniate eastern-rite church, allied with The Holy See through Congregatio pro Ecclesiis Orientalibus. In 1917 the patriarch consecrated Mar Antoine.

Through reception into the Eastern Church by the Titular Archbishop of Iconium and Apostolic Delegate of Canada and The New World (1918), Petro di Maria (1865-1938), and the Titular Archbishop of Tarsus (1924), Alexis Lépicier (1863-1936), both acting on behalf of Sancta Sedes, and consent from the Protestant Episcopal bishop of New York, William Thomas Manning (1866-1949), in 1925, May 4, Mar Antoine, assisted by Mar James (Fernand Portal) and Mar Evodius (Edward Robert Smith), in 1918 and 1922 respectively consecrated by Mar Antoine, consecrated Arthur Wolfort Brooks (1888-1948). He took the ecclesiastical name Mar John Emmanuel. At his own request, in 1926 he left The Protestant Episcopal Church, of which he has been a priest since 1916. In 1927, under leadership of Brooks, The Apostolic-Episcopal Universal Church grew out of The Anglican Universal Church of Christ in the United States of America (Chaldean) and was in 1932 incorporated as The Apostolic Episcopal Church (Holy Eastern Catholic and Apostolic Orthodox Church). In 1929 Brooks was consecrated sub conditione by the former bishop of The Protestant Episcopal Church, William Montgomery Brown (1855-1937), now of The Old Catholic Church in America, and in 1930 consecrated sub conditione by Cornelius Nicholas A Smit, who at that time joined The Apostolic Episcopal Church as a bishop. In 1933, in connection with his appointment as provincial coadjutor of The Order of Corporate Reunion, Brooks was consecrated sub conditione by William Albert Nichols (1877-1947), bishop of The Holy Eastern Orthodox Catholic and Apostolic Church in North America (a mission within The North American Diocese of The Russian Orthodox Church).

The Apostolic Episcopal Church, with headquarters at Christ's Church By-The-Sea on Long Island, spread in the beginning of 1930's by absorbing other congregations on Long Island, such as The Lord's Evangelical Church under William Henry DuBois, The Visiting Church under Harold F A Jarvis, a congregation under Charles William Keller and a black mission under Cyrus Augustine Starkey [later, 1944-1952 bishop of The African Orthodox Church of New York and Massachussetts, 1952-1960 of The North American Old Roman Catholic Church, 1960-1965 of The American Orthodox Church]. Through Damianos, 1897-1931 patriarch of The Greek Orthodox Patriarchate of Jerusalem, Brooks was authorized to appoint John More-Moreno, archpriest [in 1933 consecrated by archbishop Sophronios Bishara of The Holy Eastern Orthodox Catholic and Apostolic Church in North America] of The Holy Eastern Orthodox Catholic and Apostolic Church in North America and The Apostolic Episcopal Church, to have charge of some congregations in Manhattan and Brooklyn. Besides The Protestant Episcopal Church and the other previously mentioned churches, Brooks had a close relationship to many other churches such as The Armenian Orthodox Patriarchate of Jerusalem (through patriarch Yeghishe Tourian), The Ecumenical Patriarchate (through archbishop Damaskinos, personal representative of patriarch Photios II), The Holy Orthodox Church in America ([formerly The Anglican Universal Church of Christ in the United States of America (Chaldean)] through archbishop-primate George Winslow Plummer), The Moravian Church [Unitas Fratrum] (through bishop John Taylor Hamilton), The Methodist Episcopal Church, The Reformed Episcopal Church, The Liberal Catholic Church, and Baptist, Congregational and Presbyterian congregations. In 1934 Brooks consecrated Jarvis and Keller. After receiving advice from archbishop Athenagoras [later, 1948-1972 ecumenical patriarch] of The Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of North and South America, 1941-1944 Brooks was acting as presiding bishop of The Old Catholic Orthodox Church in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. In 1946 he elevated Wallace de Ortega Maxey (1902-1992), archbishop-primate of The Ancient Christian Fellowship (The Old Catholic Church in America), as archbishop of the new-created Province of the West and to be his successor as archbishop-primate. Later that same year, Brooks consecrated, assisted by Jarvis, Keller and Moreno, Herman Philippus Abbinga (1894-1968), a former priest of The Liberal Catholic Church, as missionary bishop for The Netherlands and The East Indies. In 1952 Abbinga was excommunicated and founded an independent jurisdiction, Oosters Apostolisch Episcopale Kerk. When in 1953 Perry Nikolaus Cedarholm (1890-1979), in 1943 ordained priest by Brooks, since 1944 a canon at Christ's Church By-The-Sea and in 1949 consecrated by Moreno, settled in Sweden, the native country of his parents, he established the archdiocese of Scandinavia.

In 1948 de Ortega Maxey succeeded Brooks as the second primate. In 1986 he enthroned Bertil Persson of Scandinavia as the third primate, in 1971 consecrated by Cedarholm. During 1970's-90's The Apostolic Episcopal Church entered intercommunion with a number of jurisdictions, e.g. The Catholic Apostolic Church ["The Irvingites"] (through rev Norman Priddle, int. hqts., Gordon Square, London, UK), The Methodist Episcopal Church (through bishop Odd Hagen), The Original Unitarian Church [in 1568 founded by bishop Francis Dávid (1520-1579)] (through bishops Joseph Ferencz and Lajos Kovács), The Syrian Patriarchate of Antioch and All the East (through patriarch Moran Mor Ignatius XXXIX Yacoub III and Mor Zakka Iwas [archbishop of Baghdad, from 1980 as Moran Mor Ignatius XL Zakka I Iwas patriarch]), The Ancient Church of the East (through patriarch Maran Mar Adhai II), The Independent African Orthodox Church (through patriarch Moran Mor James II [Daniel James Augustine Kanyiles]), The Holy Orthodox Church in America (through archbishop-primate Theodotus S De Witow), The American Catholic Church (Syro-Antiochean) (through archbishop-primate Herbert T Wilkie). The Old Roman Catholic Church in Italy (through archbishop-primate Viktor I Busà), Patriarcat Orthodoxe de l'Europe Latine (through patriarch Louis J S Canivet), Ordo Mysticus Eremitarum Sancti Augustini (through abbot-general Philippe L De Coster), The North American Old Roman Catholic Church (through archbishop-primate Edgar Ramon Verostek), The American World Patriarchates (through patriarch Uladyslau I [Uladyslau Ryzy-Ryski]), The American Orthodox Catholic Church (through patriarch Christian I [John Arthur Chiasson]), The Church of The Ascension (through archbishop-primate George William Boyer), Église de la Nouvelle Alliance (through patriarch Stephanos [Roger Caro]), Patriarcat Copte Orthodoxe d'Alexandrie, Eparchie de France (through Amba Marcos), The Melkite-Greek Catholic Church (through patriarch Maximos V Hakim), Gesellschaft des Guten Hirten (through superior general Victor J J Schoonbroodt), Église Chrétienne Catholique Traditionnelle/The Traditional Christian Catholic Church (through archbishop-primate Thomas Julius Ottó Csernohorszky-Fehérváry [a confirmation of full communion, in 1932 entered through bishop

Victor J Alexander de Kubinyi]), Iglesia Católica Apostólica Méxicana (through archbishopprimate Emile Rodriguez Fairfield), The Celtic Catholic Church (through archbishop-primate Thomas Illtyd Thomas), The Reformed Catholic Church (through archbishop-primate Richard Kenneth Hurgon [a confirmation of full communion, in 1946 entered through archbishop Wallace de Ortega Maxey]), Iglesia Filipina Independiente (through obispo maximo Macario Vilches Ga), Igreja Católica Apostólica Brazileira (through archbishop-primate Luís Castillo Méndez), The Christ Catholic Church of the Americas and Europe (through patriarch Peter II [Peter Andreas Zhurawetsky]), The Western Orthodox Catholic Church in America (through archbishop-exarch Joseph John Skureth), The Ethiopian Orthodox Coptic Church of North & South America & Europe (through metropolitan-archbishop-primate Philip Lewis), Iglesia Católica Ortodoxa en México (through obispo primado Octavio Correal Salazar).

During 1980's-90's The Apostolic Episcopal Church created a number of dioceses. In 1983 The Apostolic Episcopal Church established a diocese for Continental Europe and a diocese for Polish-speaking people in The British Isles, in 1986 founded The Caribbean Episcopal Church of The British Isles, in 1988 established an European diocese for The Philippines and in 1989 a diocese of Canada, and in 1993 reestablished the diocese of The British Isles and in 1994 the diocese of Java and The Far East. During the same decades missions in Africa and Australia were created and in 1996 The Methodist Renaissance Church of Pakistan was incorporated as a diocese.

Since 1998 Francis Cajetan Spataro, bishop of The Holy Orthodox Church in America and archbishop-metropolitan of North America of The Apostolic Episcopal Church, is the fourth primate. He has continued the ecumenical efforts such as affiliated a number of Continuing Anglican congregations and independent missions, entered full communion with Iglesia Católica Anglicana del Ecuador and incorporated The Anglican Church under the late archbishop Edwin Caudill (1932-1998) with The Apostolic Episcopal Church. Since 1995 he is provincial of North America of The Order of Corporate Reunion and from 1998 archbishop of USA of both The Uniate Western Catholic Church, that is the church side of The Order of Corporate Reunion, and The Universal Christian Communion & The Universal Episcopal Communion. In 1996 he was the co-founder of The Association of Independent Evangelical Lutheran Churches and in 2000-2002 Bishop Visitor, St. Peter & St. Paul Independent Evangelical Lutheran Church, New York. For his work in USA Lutheran Communities, The Wittenberg Lutheran Seminary of Missouri in January 2004 awarded him an honorary Doctor of Divinity. In 2000, 23-24 September, The Apostolic Episcopal Church signed concordate of intercommunion with the following churches: The Anglican Independent Communion, The Byelorussian Orthodox National Church in Exile, The Ethiopian Orthodox Archdiocese of North and South America, The Uniate Western Catholic Church.

The Apostolic Episcopal Church is a western-rite extension of The Chaldean Catholic Church, an evangelical-eccumenical-ecclesiastical movement, oriented to New Thought and New Age according to the original understanding of these concepts, and works in the spirit of the declaration of the Assembly of The World Council of Churches in New Delhi 1961. The fundamental apostolic succession is that of The Chaldean Catholic Church. The curious situation is that this uniate church since 1830 represents the apostolic succession from the apostles of Jesus (Matt 10:2-4) Tooma Shlikha (= apostle) and Addai Shlikha [Thaddai, Ehodah Bar Yacoub], founders and leaders of The Ancient Church of the East, represents the apostolic succession from Chiesa Cattolica in Italia when Julius PP III (Vicarius Christi 1550-1555) in 1553, April 9, consecrated and in 1553, April 28, in Arcibasilica San Giovanni in

Laterano solemnly invested Abouna Sa'ud Bar Daniel (murdered 1555) as Maran Mar Youhannan Shimun VIII Soulaqa, Patriarch of The Chaldean Catholic Church.

The Apostolic Episcopal Church still holds the special mission signed by Brooks: 1. To bring into clearer manifestation the Ancient Fourfold Mission of the Universal Church, viz.:

a) True Apostolicity.

b) True Prophetic Office.

c) Unbiased and unhampered preaching of Christ the Messiah.

d) Demonstrating DIVINE LOVE through true pastoral work.

2. To awaken in the minds and hearts of mankind all over the earth the Blessed Hope of the Return of Jesus the Christ, and to prepare ourselves for His Coming.

The awakening in man of his true destiny, that he may once again exercise those charismatic gifts of the Holy Spirit, with which the Church was once so generously endowed.
 To demonstrate before the world the Grace of the Sacramental Life as it can manifest in body, soul and spirit.

5. To revive and practice the Divine Gift of Healing.

6. To act as a center for the reunion of Christendom; especially Eastern and Western Branches of the One Holy Catholic Apostolic and Orthodox Church.

The Apostolic Episcopal Church is maintaining the Bible tradition from The Chaldean Catholic Church by using the English translation by George M Lamsa of The Holy Gospels from P'shitta, *The New Testament According to the Eastern Text*. Aramaic is the native language of Jesus.

The main liturgy of The Apostolic Episcopal Church is *The Divine Liturgy. Holy Eucharist. According to the Order and Usage established in the Apostolic Episcopal Church*, in 1943 published by Brooks. It consists of the Protestant Episcopal Church missal with elements from liturgies used by the Eastern churches.

Membership: Ca 1 million, in North & South America, Africa, Australia, Europe, Pakistan.

The First Rosicrucian Church of America (Ecclesiae Rosicrucianae Catholicae) founded 1909 by George W Plummer joined The Anglican Universal Church of Christ in the United States of America (Chaldean) founded 1924 by Arthur W Brooks which in 1927 was devided into The Anglican Universal Church of Christ in the United States of America (Chaldean) with Plummer as Archbishop

and

The Apostolic-Episcopal Universal Church with Brooks as Archbishop in 1932 incorporated as The Apostolic Episcopal Church (The Holy Eastern Catholic and Apostolic Orthodox Church)

The Eastern Orthodox Catholic Church founded in 1951 by James Toombs as a growth of his mission at 221 W 69th St, NYC

and the same year affiliated with Moreno but in June/July 1951 joined **The Russian Orthodox Church Outside Russia**

and the remains of **The Eastern Orthodox Catholic Church** and **The Holy Eastern Orthodox Catholic and Apostolic Church in North America** became in 1951 recognized by Moreno with the name **The Eastern Orthodox Catholic Church in America** **The Holy Eastern Orthodox Catholic and Apostolic Church in North America** founded 2 February1927 by Aftimios Ofiesh

which 2 November 1933 was devided into **The Holy Orthodox Church in America** (Eastern Catholic and Apostolic) with William A. Nichols as Bishop with whom in 1934 Plummer and his church joined

and

The Holy Eastern Orthodox Catholic and Apostolic Church in North America with Sophronios Bishara and from 1934 with John More-Moreno as Archbishop

ON 'APOSTOLIC SUCCESSION'

Through his ordination as a priest – see *Appendixes* - and consecration as a bishop my original consecrator Perry N Cedarholm (1890-1979) is representing two theological schools on *apostolic succession* which more or less freely have been in conflict with each other. Each of them has also been soil for sundry interpretations, from serious to odd ones. In order to have the adequate understanding of this conception, it seems necessary to start from the Jewish context of its origin.

1. After a time as *disciple* [Aram.: *talmida* (sing.); Hebr.: *talmid* (sing.); Greek: *mathetes* (sing.); Latin; *discipulus* (sing.)], Jesus, his *master* [Hebrew: *rabbi*; cf. Mark 10:35], sent him out with his message, not in writing, only viva voce. This delivery of knowledge from master to disciple is a *teaching succession*.

2. Jesus and his disciples read their holy scriptures in *Tanakh* (1) in Hebrew, but their mother tongue was Aramaic. (2) When this message was propagated westward, all key-words were first translated into Greek, then into Latin, including the titles of the different officials in the Jewish congregation. (3)

3. Every Jewish *congregation* [Aram.: *kanasha*; Hebr.: *minyan* or *tzibur*; Greek: *ekklesia*; Latin: *congregatio*] was in the hands of *elders* [Aram.: *qashisha* (sing.); Hebr.: *zaken* (sing.); Greek: *presbyteros* (sing.); Latin: *senior* (sing.); English: *priest*; cf. Acts 4:8 (4)], led by an *overseer* [Aram.: *abouna*; (5) Hebr.: *paqidh*; Greek: *episkopus*; Latin: *superintendens*]. The congregation was joining in *Beith Haknesset* [Aram.: *kanushta*; Greek: *synagogae*; Latin: *ecclesia*]. The synagogue was administrated by an *official* [Aram.: *arkuna*; Hebr.: *gabi*; Greek: *arkon*; Latin: *princeps*; cf. Mark 5:22], chosen among the elders. He was assisted by *assistants* [Aram.: *shamshana* (sing.); Hebr.: *kohen* (sing.); Greek: *diakonos* (sing.); Latin: *minister* (sing.)] and *teachers* [Aram.: *malfana* (sing.) or *rabi* (sing.); Hebr.: *rabbi* (sing.) or *sopher* (sing.); Greek: *didaskalos* (sing.); Latin: *magister* (sing.)]. Each one was inaugurated by laying on of hands [cf. Acts 6:6].

4. In the biblical days *laying on of hands* [Aram.: *siam eida*; Hebr.: *s'mikhah*; Greek: *epithesis ton kheiron*; Latin: *impositio*] was symbolising authority, blessing and spiritual power. (6) The Aramaic word for a person given authority [cf. Acts 13:1-3] is *shelekha*, in Hebrew *shaliach*, in Greek *apostolos* [Latin: *apostolus*], meaning *one who is sent out [as a professional and/or as a proxy]*. (7)

As the apostleś work expanded, as guarantee against alterations it became necessary to have the message of Jesus [Greek: *euangelion*] written down and to create an organisation. The *New Testament* was composed. With the organisation of the Roman Empire as prototype, a church hierarchy began to take shape. The inner life of the synagogue was maintained as far as possible. The most important change was that overseers and teachers of practical reasons became the same persons, *elders* [cf. Acts 14:23], responsible for the teaching succession, now called *apostolic succession*. It is from this development phase as the two schools on apostolic succession have generated and both are related to the role of the overseer. In Cedarholm's case, as an example, the school represented by the apostolic succession from The Methodist Episcopal Church, the bishop is a person who by laying on of hands at a ceremony, *ordination* [from Latin *ordo*, meaning *initiate*], has been sent out as a professional elder (priest) who then at a ceremony by laying on of hands has been *consecrated* [from Latin *consecro*, meaning *inaugurate*; Wesley: *set apart*] as an overseer, which is a commission of trust, given by elders and deputies from the congregations, who are guaranteeing the apostolic succession. A bishop of the school representing the apostolic succession from The Chaldean Catholic Church is not only through ordination a priest but as consecrated also the incarnation of the apostolic succession.

The Oriental churches, Chiesa Cattolica in Italia, (8) The Church of England and her offshoots (The Anglican Communion Worldwide) and The Union of Ütrecht of the Old Catholic Churches advocate the last mentioned school. At least in Chiesa Cattolica in Italia deviations have been done. Bonifatius PP IX (1350-1404), 1389-1404 Vicarius Christi, Martinus PP V (1369 or 1370-1431), 1417-1431 Vicarius Christi, and Innocentius VIII (1432-1492), 1484-1492 Vicarius Christi, have authorised Cistercian abbots, who were only priests, to ordain priests. (9) Similar cases in The Church of England are accounted in Mathew, *op. cit.*.

John Wesley (1703-1791), the pioneer of The Methodist Episcopal Church, was of an opinion like that of Martin Luther (1483-1546), the instigator to the Evangelical-Lutheran churches. (10) Luther states, and here quotations from Althaus : "Die wahre apostolische Sukzession ist das Evangelium: wer das Evangelium rein verkündigt, der steht in der echten Sukzession. 39I, 191, 28: Haec est vera definitio Ecclesiae, non quae succedit Apostolis, sed quae confitetur, quod Christus sit filius Dei. - 39II, 176, 5.177, 1: Successio ad Evangelium est alligata... Man soll sehen, who das Verbum ist... Ubi est verbum, ibi est Ecclesia... Credendum est episcopo, non quia succedit episcopo hujus loci, sed quia docet Evangelium. Evangelium soll die Sukzession sein." (11) With reference to 39II, 176, 5.20 Althaus continues: "Diese Kontinuität der Geistesleitung, der Bewahrung der wahren Kirche ist nun gerade nicht identisch mit der offiziellen Tradition und angeblichen apostolischen Sukzession des Kirchentums und wirt durch sie nicht garantiert." (12)

Notes

(1) *Tanakh* is the Jewish Bible, the Christian *Old Testament*. The word is made up by the three initial letters for the sections which constitute the Jewish Bible: T = Torah [Law], N = Neviim [Prophets], KH = Kethuvim [Writings].

(2) Not all understood Hebrew, why the reading of the texts in the synagogue must be related in Aramaic. Such translation or paraphrase is called *targum*. Cf. Luke 4:16-21.

In *Tanakh* there are three records dealing with the priesthood: "the priests of the Levites" (in *Deuteronomy*), "the priests of the sons of Aaron" (especially in *Leviticus* and *Numbers*), "the priests of the Levites, the sons of Zadok" (in *Ezekiel*). (5) In Aramaic-speaking churches the form of address to a clergyman in general is *abouna*, originally = *the respectful one*. Jesus was addressed abouna. In order to secure the apostolate for the future work of the Methodist movement in America. Wesley was secretly consecrated in 1736, July 18, in Savannah, GA, USA, by David Nitschmann (1697-1772), 1735-1772 Bishop of Unitas Fratrum (The Moravian Church). This is evident when Wesley 1784, 2 September, "set apart as a Superintendet" Thomas Coke (1747-1814) for the Methodist Societies in America and when the societies soon become organised as The Methodist Episcopal Church. The societies in The British Isles are organised in a Congregational way. Important is the fact that Wesley was strongly influenced by his close friend Bishop Thomas Deacon (1697-1753), founder of a branch of The English Nonjurors, The True British Catholic Church ("The Manchester Nonjurors" or "The Separatists"). Assisted by Rev. Vasey and Rev. Whatcoat, (2) Rev. Wesley "set apart as a Superintendent" of the Methodist Societies in America 1784, 2 September

Thomas Coke (1747-1814)

Ordained deacon, The Church of England (1770, June 10) Ordained priest, The Church of England (1772, August 23) Superintendent of the Methodist Societies in America (1784) Assisted by Rev. Vasey, Rev. Whatcoat and Rev. Philip William Otterbein (3), Superintendent Coke consecrated as Bishop-Superintendent during The Conference 1784, 27 December

Francis Asbury (1745-1816)

Ordained deacon, The Methodist Societies in America (1784, December 25) Ordained priest, The Methodist Societies in America (1784, December 26) Superintendent, The Methodist Episcopal Church (1784) Assisted by Bishops Philip Bruce, Freeborn Garrettson (1752-1827), Jesse Lee (1758-1816) and Thomas Ware (1758-1842), Bishop Asbury consecrated as Bishop during The General Conference of The Methodist Episcopal Church 1808, 17 May

Beverly Waugh (1789-1858) and Thomas Asbury Morris (1794-1874)

Bishops Joshua Soule, Elijah Hedding, Waugh and Morris consecrated as Bishop during The General Conference of The Methodist Episcopal Church 1844, 10 June

Edmund Storer Janes (1807-1876)

Bishops Beverly Waugh, Thomas Asbury Morris and Janes consecrated as Bishop during The General Conference of The Methodist Episcopal Church 1852, 27 May

Levi Scott (1802-1882)

He consecrated as Bishop during The General Conference of The Methodist Episcopal Church 1880, 19 May

Cyrus David Foss (1834-1910)

He consecrated as Bishop during The General Conference of The Methodist Episcopal Church 1904, 24 May

William Frazer McDowell (1858-1937)

He consecrated as Bishop during The General Conference of The Methodist Episcopal Church 1916, 29 May (5)

Thomas Nicholson (1862-1944)

He ordained as Elder during The Western Conference at Harcourt, Iowa, 1918, 24 August

Perry N Cedarholm (1890-1979) (6)

Notes

(1) James Creighton (1737-1819) was in 1765 ordained deacon and priest of The Church of Ireland . - The first consecration was performed with Wesley as the authority while the future consecrations were performed with The General Conference as the authority. This is caused of the fact that Wesley was consecrated by David Nitschmann (1697-1772), 1735-1772 Bishop of Unitas Fratrum (The Moravian Church). Ref. (3) Philip William [Wilhelm] Otterbein (1726-1813) was born in Germany. In 1749 he was ordained minister of Reformierte Kirche. In 1752 he arrived at America. In 1759 he became pastor of the Second German Reformed Church, Baltimore. In 1789 he organized The United Brethren in Christ (sometimes called "The German Methodists"). 12 May 1800 he was consecrated by Superintendents Asbury and Coke. 25 September 1800 he was elected Bishop of The United Brethren in Christ. (6) The present author has composed the chain of bishops strictly according to Wesley's instruction why it differs in some cases from the list available at General Commission on Archives and History of The United Methodist Church, Madison, NJ, USA. Up until 1864, the rite of ordaining a bishop accompanying the imposition of hands has followed the following wording instructed by Wesley:

"Receive the Holy Ghost for the office and work of a Superintendent in the church of God, now committed unto thee by the imposition of our hands, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. *Amen*. And remember that thou stir up the grace of God which is given thee by this imposition of our hands; for God hath not given us the spirit of fear, but the power, and love, and soberness."

(5) Jan Aeneas (d. 1594) was consecrated 30 August 1577. 1590-1594 President. Zacharias Ariston (Zacharias von Leitomischl, d. 1590) was consecrated 30 August 1577. 1588-1590 President.

(6) Jacob Narcissus (d. 1611) was consecrated 14 July 1594. 1608-1611 President.

(7) Matthias Koeczy (d. 1622) was consecrated 1609. Matthias Cyrus (d. 1618) was consecrated 1611.

(8) Jablonsky had got a written approval to the consecration from Bishop Christian Sitkovius of Thorn, Poland. Sitkovius was consecrated 1734.
